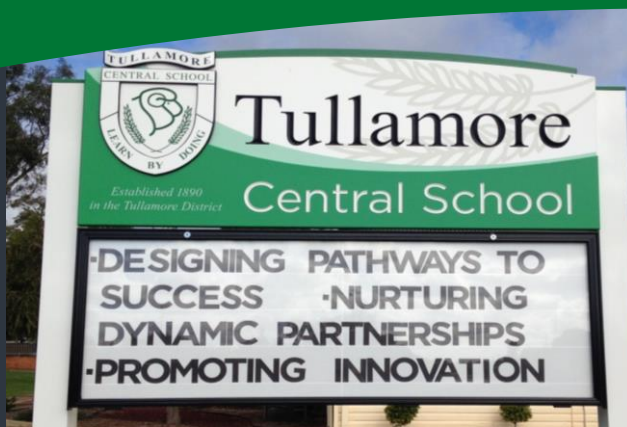

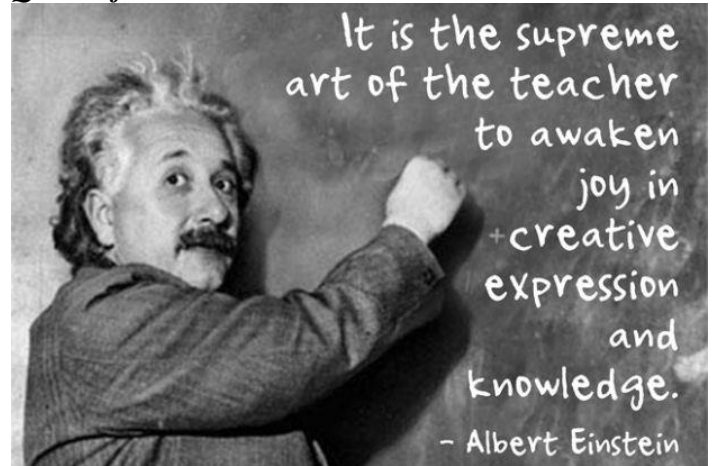
A great fete mate!

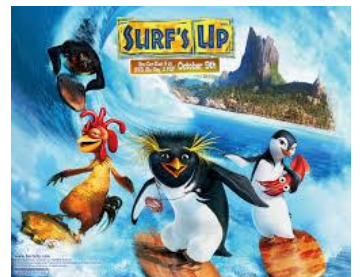


SUPER 8s CRICKET

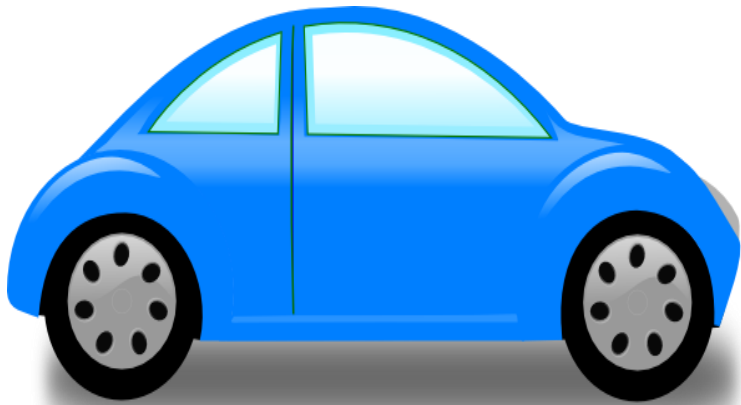
