


Western Access Program promotion



2016 Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania scholarships

Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania and Northparkes Mines invite eligible students, in Year 11, to apply for the 2016 Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania Scholarship.

This program is designed to attract and retain senior secondary students who are interested in the mining industry as a possible career. This is achieved through a coordinated program of activities and contact with the industry and stakeholders such as sponsoring companies and universities.

Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania Scholarship recipients will receive an award of:

- ***\$500 for successful completion of Year 11,***
- ***\$1,000 for successful completion of Year 12, and;***
- ***\$2,000 is granted to those scholarship students who go on to successfully complete their first year in an undergraduate mining related course at a NSW University within the first 12 months of completing their secondary schooling.***

As part of the Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania Scholarship program, scholarship holders in Year 11 and Year 12 must participate in a minimum of two mining related activities each year. Examples of activities include: work experience, attendance at a careers expo organised or conducted by the mining industry, mentoring programs, sponsored Northparkes events or attendance at a relevant university open day.

Sumitomo Metal Mining Oceania Scholarship Eligibility Criteria:

- 1) ***Students must be enrolled at a high school within the Parkes or Forbes Local Government Areas and maintain a set pattern of study with satisfactory academic results.***
- 2) ***To be eligible to extend the scholarship from Year 11 to Year 12, scholarship holders must demonstrate participation in at least two mining related activities during the year.***
- 3) ***To be eligible to extend the scholarship post Year 12, students must enrol in and satisfactorily complete, their first year of an Undergraduate mining/minerals related degree.***
- 4) ***Applications must include the name and contact details of a teacher at the student's school who will be contacted to obtain a reference check. Applications without these details will not be considered.***

2016 TRANGIE JUNIOR JUDGING- MONDAY 4th JULY

Announcing the annual Trangie Junior Judging Day- to be held on the first Monday of the public school holidays at the Trangie Agricultural Research Station.

This year the Trangie Junior Judging Day's program includes seven sections: Beef Cattle, Merino Sheep, Meat Sheep (Border Leicesters and Poll Dorsets), Merino Fleeces, Cotton, Grains and Angora & Mohair! The format of the day is set up so that each competitor participates in all judging sections within their age group: Seniors- 15 to 24years, Juniors- 10 to 15years, and Sub-Juniors- Under 10 years, who may have a parent to help them.

The facilities at the NSW DPI's Trangie Ag Research Centre (TARC) will again be generously be available, a few km west of Trangie township on the Mitchell Highway. At the TARC's Cattle Section there is a perfect open grassy area with yards and plenty room for the many competitors. The Trangie Judging Day draws keen competitors from the not only the Trangie district but surrounding areas as well- often from Warren, Narromine, Nyngan, Nevertire, Tottenham, Parkes, Dubbo, Gilgandra, Gulgambone and Orange districts. Over many years the winners of the Senior section (15 to 24 years) at Trangie have gone on to win competitions at regional and then state level (at Sydney's Royal Easter Show) after gaining valuable experience from at the Trangie Judging Day. Many of the experienced overjudges for each section have been Judges and Stewards at Sydney and numerous local shows.

Sub-Junior and Junior groups are given a judging overview in each section to boost their knowledge before judging each class. This year Sub-Juniors will participate in a learning session rather than the competition of the older age groups. All ages have a chance of seeing their name engraved on silver trophies with a long history, many dating back to the 1940's, with Trangie district identities' names still visible as previous Junior Judging Champions. This year NSW FARMERS will be donating cash prizes for the pointscore winners.

The full day's program starts with registration at 8.30am, at the Cattle Section at the Trangie Ag Research Centre. The entry fee for the day is \$15 per competitor, which includes a BBQ lunch, while extra snacks and drinks will be on sale too. Organisers (and the kids!) rely on competitors' parents kindly providing a home-baked slice, cake or packet of bikkies for morning tea. Don't forget your winter woollies as it WILL BE COLD! All competitors are to bring their own clipboard and pen, and any parents able to stay and help would be greatly appreciated.

This year preregistration is encouraged to help speed things up on the day- Register and pay by

Wednesday 24th June to qualify for the reduced entry fee of \$12. Email


