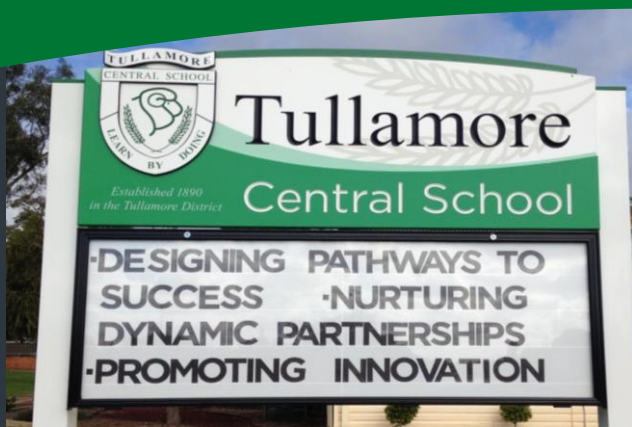

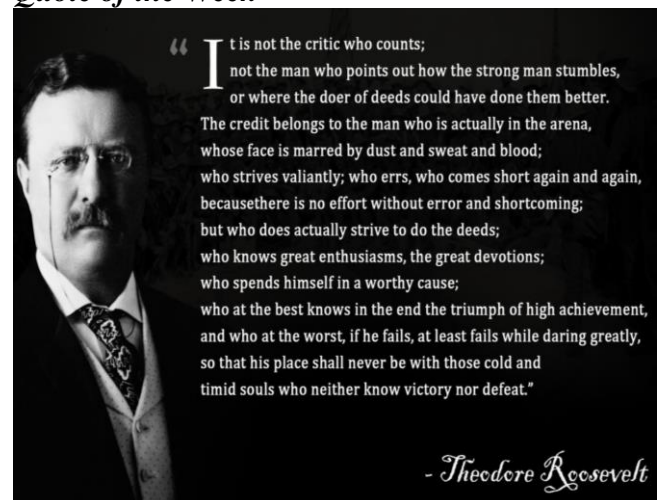

This week will see our enterprise leaders continuing to work with our Pee Wees. Our enterprise leaders have organised rosters with their Pee Wees. If those Pee Wees involved in these session could ensure that they have some enclosed leather shoes or boots at school on those days so they can safely participate.

Fundraising

Currently we are fundraising for a poly tunnel. This will enable us to grow vegetables that are normally summer crops all year round, such as corn, tomatoes, zucchini, pumpkins etc. So far our vegetable enterprise is supplying our local store with seasonal produce, which is helping us pay for grain feed for our cattle and pay for some expenses, but through expansion we hope to be turning a profit that we can sink in to new and improved enterprises next year such as an aquaculture setup to

raise our own barramundi, which will be available for the community to purchase.

Now Taking Orders For Dressed Chooks



In Term 3, students in Year 8 will be conducting a poultry trial as part of their Broiler enterprise unit. This means that Tullamore Community members will have the chance to order an organically raised dressed chook. The meat chooks will be raised by the students from day old to when they are sent to the abattoir for processing.

They will return, dressed and cryovac packed ready for roasting. If you wish to order a chook, please contact the school office by Friday 2nd July as we will soon need to order our required quantity of day old meat chicks.

Dressed Chooks will be approximately \$15 per chook which covers the cost of feed and processing for the duration of the enterprise.
