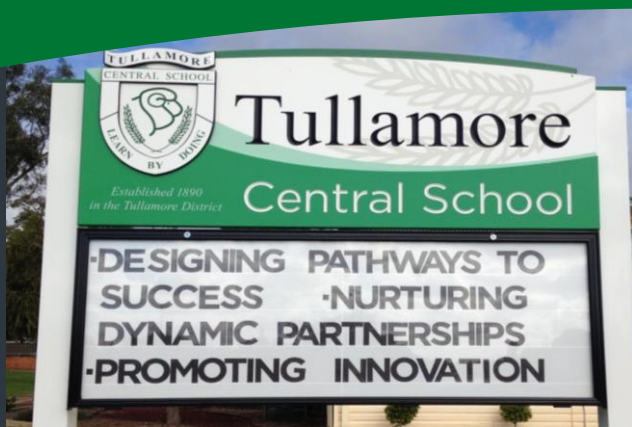

AG IN ACTION

Science Meets Agriculture

Year 8 Ag students have begun to perform some preparatory investigations into the condition of the soils in the ag plot in preparation for the planting of our winter vegetables. Here are our budding agricultural scientists in action testing soil pH using Universal indicator and barium Sulfate testing methods. They have also performed soil porosity and soil texture tests to determine the type of soil in their samples.

- Installing some new troughs into paddocks 1 and 2 of the ag farm
- Erecting shade shelters in paddocks 1 and 2 of the ag farm
- Erecting the new broiler pen for meat bird production

If parents / students or community members are able to help us out if they could please let Miss Shankelton know preferred dates and availability and we will try to settle on a date that suits the majority.

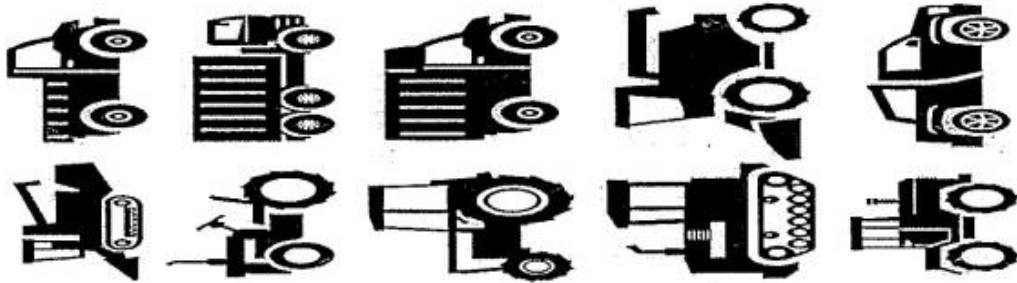


