



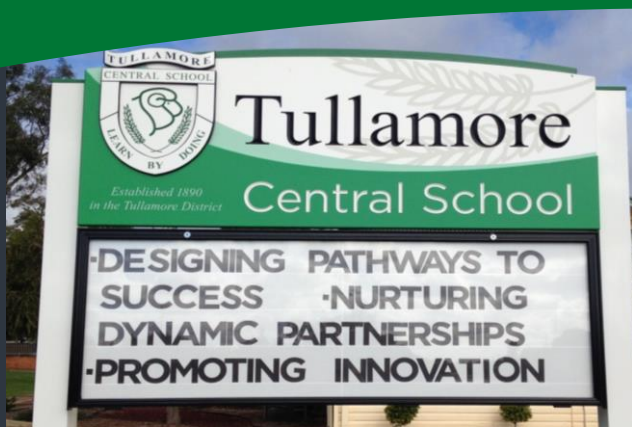

AGRICULTURE IN ACTION – YEOVAL SHOW SUCCESS

Our Novice Cattle Show team members travelled to Yeoval Show to compete in the Heifer and Cow Classes and the parading competition. Congratulations to Zarli who lead Paradgim Karan to first place in the Heifer 16 Months and Under 24 Months class and to Charlie who led Emiance T Kandy to First place in the Heifer over 30 Months.

Both animals were called in for Champion, with Kandy just missing Reserve Champion. Congratulations to Charlotte who placed third in her Novice Parader class. The fourth member of our team, Mackenzie did a fantastic job keeping our cows fed, watered and looking beautiful for their classes and our area neat and tidy.

We now set our sights on Tullamore Show where we will be exhibiting our 3 Heifers (Klover, Kandy and Nellie) plus also preparing stud stock from Little Milky Way Stud for show at Tullamore.



Melbourne Ag Team Excursion

After a massive day at Yeoval Show students then boarded the Tully Bus for an excursion to the Deepfields Quarantine facility and to the Dookie Food and Fibre Careers day. At Deepfields, the managers Dean and Lynton from Headly John Exporters ran our students through the quarantine processes and how the farm has been set up to cater from the Asian market, specifically China and Japan.

Students learned about the process from acquiring the stock from farmers, to the arrival at the centre and the management procedures performed whilst in quarantine through to their departure on planes to China and Japan. In the centre currently is a flock of Dorpers from Tullamore, destined as a foundation flock for China and a herd of Holstein Friesian Heifers, destined as a foundation dairy herd to Japan.

On Thursday night, the University of Melbourne put on an indigenous foods night for our students. Here students sampled fresh oysters and mussels that had been cooked using Aniseed and Lemon Myrtle native plants, Kangaroo burgers and Kakadu plum sauces. Although some things were not to some

people's likening it was great to see all of our students try some of the not so familiar foods. We have also been presented from this workshop a set of fire sticks.

On the second day of the excursion, students attended the University of Melbourne – Dookie Campus Food and Fibre Careers day. Here students attended presentations on the beef cattle industry and the career opportunities available and pathways of study, plant science, sheep and wool industry, weed eradication, indigenous agriculture and a tour of the robotic dairy. The robotic dairy is totally automated. Cows voluntarily take themselves to be milked and fed (because it is voluntary we did not get to see it in action unfortunately!)

Thank you to Max Davison who accompanied us on the excursion and to Richard and Diane Darcy for their assistance with putting us in contact with the quarantine facility to enable this learning experience for our students.


