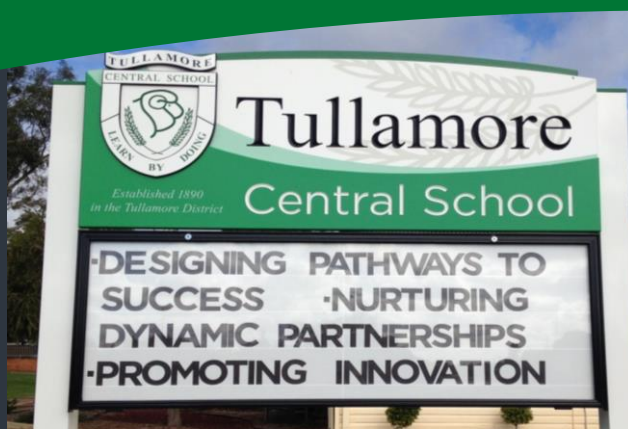

NAPLAN

From Tuesday 9th to Thursday 11th May students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit NAPLAN assessments. These provide a snapshot of student skills in some aspects of Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, Writing and Numeracy. NAPLAN testing is important and provides useful diagnostic information, alongside a range of school based diagnostic tools, to assist our staff in tailoring additional support as required. We encourage all students to do their very best at NAPLAN, however, our school will not engage in excessive NAPLAN preparation at the expense of other curriculum and extracurricular areas.

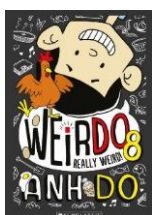
LIBRARY NEWS
