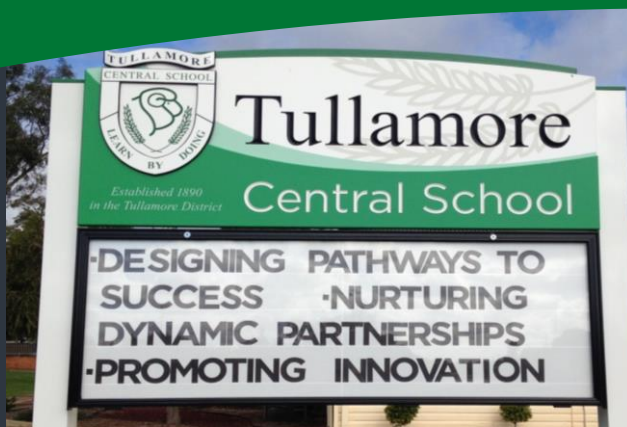

Fidget Spinners

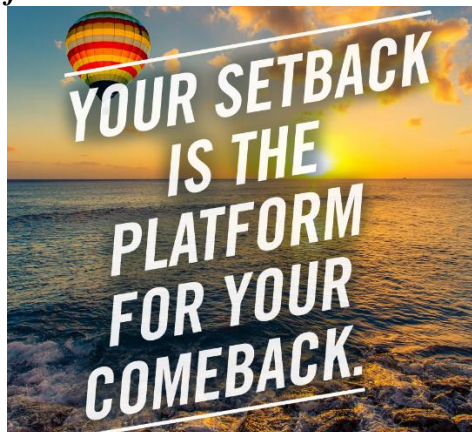
Just to clarify for everyone in the school community, students may bring fidget spinners to school, however should leave them in their bag during class time.

TERM 2 2017 – WEEK 9 STAGE 4 SCIENCE IN ACTION

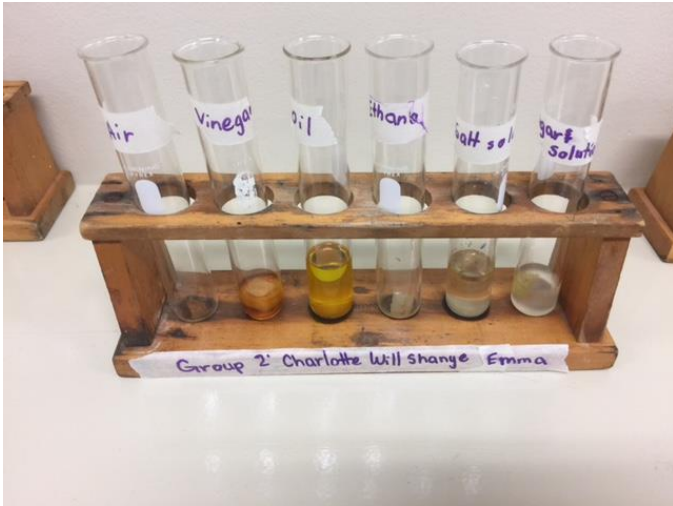
Students in stage 4 Science have been studying the various microbes that exist in our environments, including those that are involved in food preservation and decomposition.

Our students have set up an experiment that examined the various mediums that can be used to prevent microbial growth in preserving foods. They have tested oil, sugar syrup, saline solution, ethanol and vinegar to see how effective these are at preserving foods.



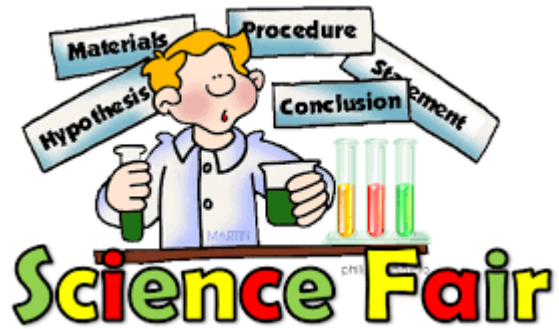
The control of the experiment was exposed to air with no preserving substance. The pictures below show our results





Our results have shown that oil and vinegar are our best preservatives for preventing microbial growth, followed by saline and sugar solutions and ethanol. As you can see the air sample has shown a good rate of decomposition.

Students have since cultured their bacteria and fungi that have grown on the air sample and we will be examining some of these under the microscope.



Next term our budding stage 4 scientists will be working on their science research project. Students will need to come up with their own hypothesis to test. This will then culminate in a science fair where parents and friends of our students will be able to see them demonstrate their experiment. More information will follow next term about this, along with progress photos of student's initial testing. We hope that as many people can attend our science fair and see the great work of our students.
