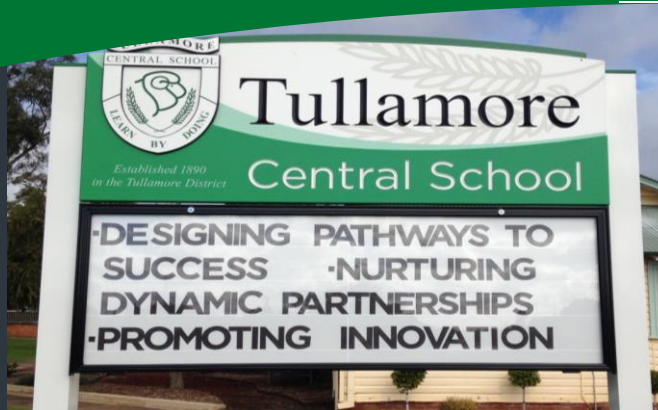

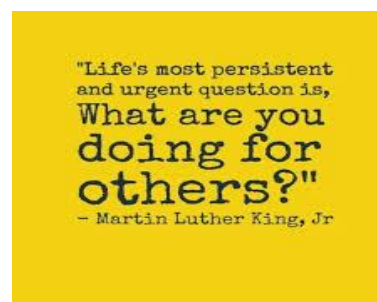
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Country before our Market Day celebrations. Thank you to all involved in organising these events.
