Congratulations to our Stage 5 and 6 Agriculture students who have been preparing our lambs for the Dubbo Show Prime Lamb Hoof & Hook competition. Our lambs did very well in the hook section of the competition coming 14th overall in the trade weight section out of 53 pens of 3 lamb in this section. We placed 40th in the Hoof section of the competition. Although our lambs were smaller in stature they had a very good dressing percentage of 53.05%. This was a good overall result in a competition with over 700 lambs entered.

Don't forget - Senior Study Centre

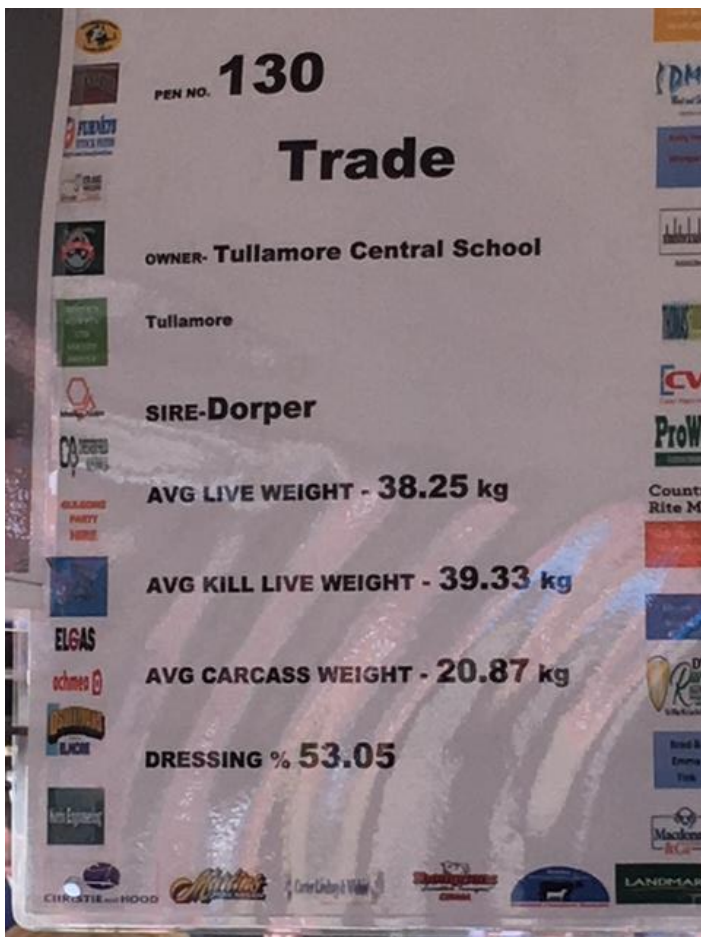

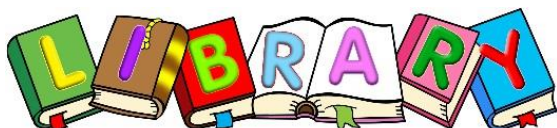


Lastly, we must take our hats off to the LACHLAN house for coming away with the overall house win.

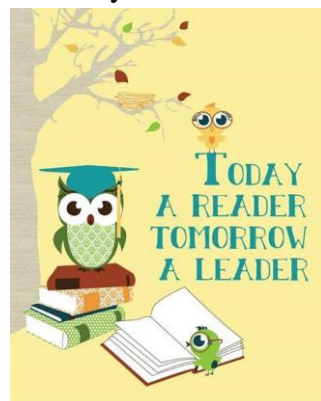

Do you know of someone who may need an extra hand? Perhaps you are an elderly resident in need of some gardening assistance?

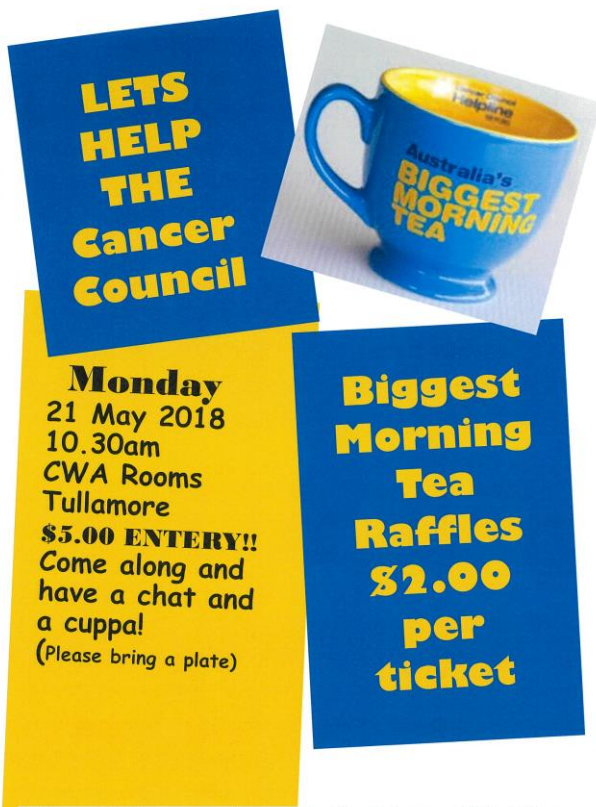
We are looking to spread some kindness across Tullamore by doing good deeds within our community. We are calling for expressions of interest for jobs that we could assist with.
