Secondary News

Some reminders for secondary students this week:

Mock Crash - Road Safety Program

Students in Years 10 - 11 will be participating in the Mock Crash Road Safety Program. Students will be attending the upcoming excursion on the 17^{th} August. Students completed pre-lessons last week that took them through licencing requirements and they also got to see the effects of alcohol consumption on reactions whilst wearing the "grog goggles" and how depth and hazard perception changes.

Headspace Study Stress Visit

Students in Year 11 will have a visit from Headspace on the 6th September. The Headspace team will be running a study stress management workshop. Students will be given organisational tools and ways to cope when studying during the session. We look forward to our visit from Amy and the Headspace Dubbo crew.

Trial HSC Examinations

Trial HSC Exams will be held in week 5 and 6. Students who are required to sit examinations have been issued with their exam timetable and a copy has also been placed on the school facebook page. Students are encouraged to ask their course coordinators for feedback on past papers and ensure they are well prepared. Students are also reminded that they are unable to take mobile phones into the examinations, so they will need to sort out the purchase or loan of a board approved calculator before the examination period begins.

Year 11 Preliminary Examinations

The final examinations to end the preliminary courses will be held in weeks 9 and 10. Students should be starting a program of revision in preparation for these. A timetable will be released soon for these and will be distributed via email and facebook.

Work Health & Safety – Shoes for Practical Subjects

Students need to ensure that they have their hats and boots for practical agriculture, along with boots for any other practical subjects such as food tech and industrial tech. They are also required for practical science where chemicals and sharps are in use. Please ensure that students have their enclosed leather shoes either on their feet or stored at the student pigeon holes so that students have them when required.

Handling Study Stress

At times students, particularly those in the senior years will be under stress due to their study loads. To assist students in coping with this stress Headspace in Dubbo offers a free study stress advisory line that students can either call or access via the Headspace Dubbo Facebook page. CWA of NSW Drought Aid Applications

CWA of NSW's Disaster Relief Committee recently released an initial \$100,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund to help farm families in NSW struggling with worsening drought conditions. This is being used for Drought Aid grants of up to \$3000 to cover groceries, vehicle maintenance, school expenses, household bills and medical costs. At the time of writing, that initial allocation has been exhausted, however the CWA of NSW have been able to continue with these grants as we have been receiving donations from CWA branches, the public and large donations such as the recent \$50,000 from the National Australia Bank.
\$300,000 from Dick Smith Foods donation will also be immediately released for the Drought Aid grants in NSW.

Those in need of assistance can visit our website <u>www.cwaofnsw.org.au/droughtaid</u> where they can apply online or using the <u>paper form</u>, ensuring they have carefully read the <u>criteria</u>.
