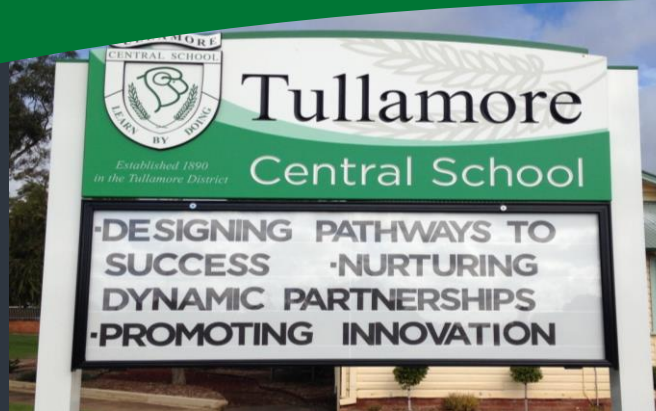

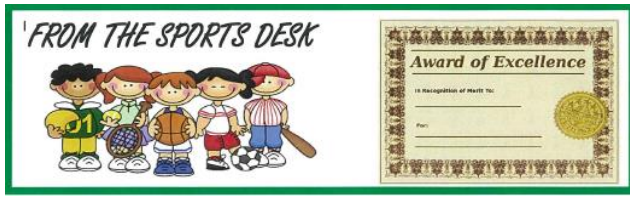

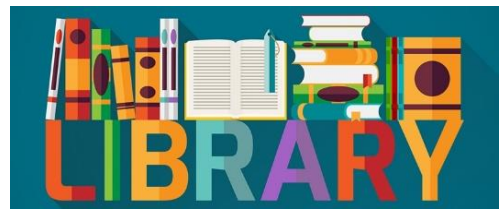
Students have been playing and enjoying tennis during sport and PE over the past few weeks. Most displaying natural talent and with more practice would gain solid life long skills in the game.
