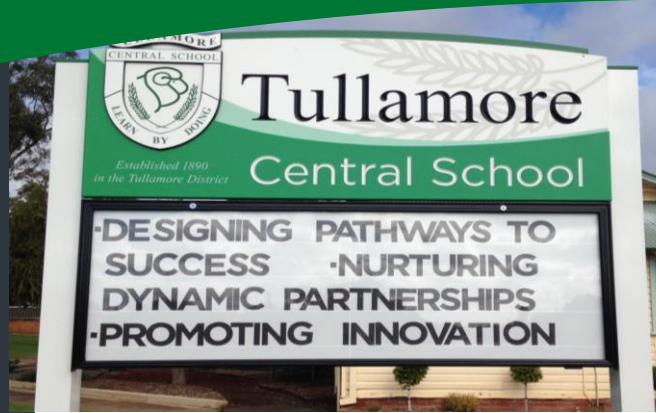

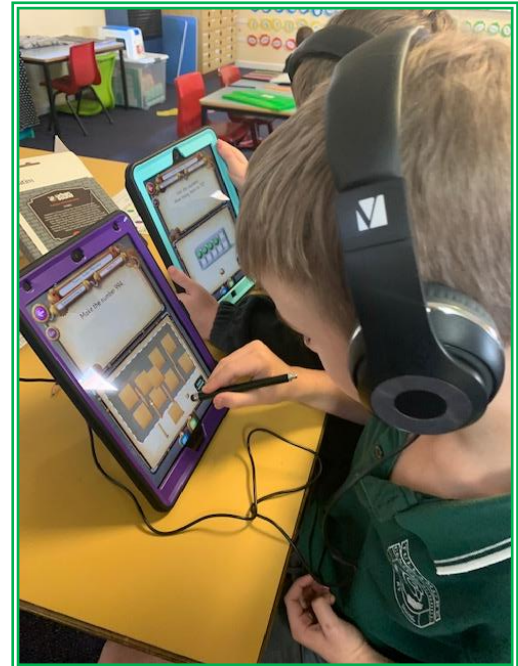

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN ENGLISH

STAGE 4 ENGLISH

This term Stage 4 will be learning all about 'The Hero's Journey'. We will be reading and engaging with *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* - which is super exciting because I love the Harry Potter Series and I am hoping that year 7/8 develops that love too. We have also started regular spelling, grammar, and reading homework, which students were a part of creating the expectations surrounding the completion of this work. I am looking forward to getting deeper into this topic with Stage 4!

STAGE 5 ENGLISH

This term, Stage 5 have been studying dystopian fiction. So far, we have unpacked what the word dystopia refers to and how these kinds of texts reflect the world that we live in. The main text for study this term is *Divergent*, by Veronica Roth. So far, students are enjoying reading as a class and are really showing growth in their understanding of how tropes of dystopias can be found in texts.

YEAR 11 ENGLISH STANDARD

Year 11 English Standard recently completed their study of Wilfred Owen's war poetry and have now moved onto the next module for study: Contemporary possibilities. So far, our students have begun investigating how digital texts influence the way we view the world. Last week, during study week, students began developing their own vlogs – which are like blogs, except in video form – on a social issue of their choice.

Only 6 and a half weeks left of Year 12 study and not very much after that until the HSC examinations! Year 12 English Standard have recently completed their study of Oodgeroo Noonuccal's poetry, which she wrote while visiting China. Students successfully demonstrated their deep knowledge of this unit through engaging and enlightening Pecha Kucha presentations at the end of last term. Currently, students are working their way through the Craft of Writing module and are already broadening their repertoire of writing skills and tools.

STAGE 6

All students studying English, as well as Drama, in Stage 6 have returned to school with enthusiasm, renewed energy and in English Studies, some lively discussions!

Year 12 are working hard to get the most from their teachers and subjects before the trials, and very soon the HSC. In this time of great stress, studying and focus for Year 12, please ensure that your young adults are taking some time to relax and de-stress too - that is just as important for their mental health and performance!
