

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maintained. We thank you for your anticipated understanding.


Student Safety

Student safety is a core priority in every NSW Public School and our collective duty of care as a staff is something that we take very seriously at Tullamore Central School. Subsequently, we have recently advised our Senior students that they will no longer be able to leave school grounds during recess due to identified concerns relating to child protection whilst students are unsupervised. In recognising that this change would inevitably cause some disappointment, we have asked Secondary to think creatively about possible alternatives that we could implement at school.

A friendly reminder that our school day commences at 8:30am. Please ensure students do not arrive before this time as supervision is not provided until teachers are on playground duty at 8:30am.

Attendance Matters

A reminder that it is a legal requirement for students to be at school unless they are unwell. In the event that families need to be away, it is a requirement of the Department of Education that this is discussed with the Principal and the appropriate leave is granted prior to the leave commencing.



Office staff will contact families if a student is absent for three consecutive days to request an explanation for the absence. A written explanation is then required to be provided to the school within seven days of the absence. Please don't hesitate to contact the front office for further information if required.

Students have been working hard over the past week. I have been impressed with the class' efforts to improve the neatness of their bookwork and engage with peers in discussions about their learning, well done.









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I am currently in the process of organising our class excursion, when finalised an itinerary and note will be sent home.






- Limit numbers to 2 adults per family.

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
